1) After learning last Wed. that Motorola will build, own, operate and maintain the network for a period of ten years we are left wondering what remains to be negotiated in the BOOM agreement. Can you please provide us with a few examples of what you anticipate negotiating into a BOOM agreement? **As discussed during last Wednesday's meeting, Motorola is now under contract with NTIA. As a result, there are a number of items that are memorialized within the BOOM agreement that inter-relate with the grant requirements and are non-negotiable; however, some items are subject to discussion with the Alameda County Sheriff's Office. Attached is a preliminary table that provides examples of this delineation.**

2) We understand that the Alameda County Sheriff's Office is the lead agency on the BTOP grant. We further understand that other cities, counties and agencies will have agreements with Alameda, not Motorola. If Alameda is supportive of the BayWeb \ BTOP Policy Group operating as a cohort to represent the region, will Motorola support this? **Motorola's Build Own Operate Maintain agreement will be directly with the Alameda County Sheriff's Office, who was selected as the Executive Sponsor and the Lead Eligible User Agency in Motorola's contract with NTIA. A change to the role of the Policy Group may not be possible under the NTIA contract and, therefore, Motorola will not support the change.**

3) Can you please step us through Motorola's certification process for 3GPP devices? **This process is not currently established but is expected to be in line with what the public carriers require for certification of devices to operate on their networks.**

4) Two part question: We understand Motorola's cost-recovery model is based on 50,000 LTE devices. Can you tell us how Motorola arrived at the 50,000 figure? And, can you please share with us the allotment formula? IE..how many per city, county and agency? **The vendor community was directed in BayRICS response to the written bidder's questions which were disseminated on November 6th to plan for 50,000 users. The specific question and answer is provided below for reference.**

Question 2 states: For business modeling purposes, how many users should we plan for subscribing to this network in the long term?

Response: Long term the number could be very large depending on the cost of subscribership for a system as self-operated or some sort of partnership that we pay to a provider. The models provided need to be scalable. Public Safety User estimates for the Bay Area are

around 50,000 users. The number could scale up with the addition of users and services. (i.e. traffic light users, public works, etc.)

Motorola anticipates that the distribution of the 50,000 users will be discussed as part of the BOOM negotiation.

5) On Wed. we discussed the need to enhance BayWeb in support of BTOP. During that conversation you mentioned the possibility of Motorola locating funding for this work. Can you please provide us with an update? **Motorola recognizes that BayLOOP requires some enhancements to support the BTOP funded BayWEB deployment. Motorola is still working through the specifics of how this work will be funded as a part of this project.**

6) One of the common questions among the cohort is coverage area. Can you please provide us with coverage maps? What ever you have by way of propagation studies, actual coverage maps, etc. would be very helpful. **As discussed in question #1, the BOOM agreement will ultimately determine the final coverage design. With that said, attached are preliminary regional coverage maps which are subject to change based upon the final coverage configuration and sites selection.**

7) We are concerned that potential system features are being marketed and advanced but the related issue of site performance profiles is unavailable to us. Can we please see specific information regarding how features such as streaming video would be expected to work in relation to site proximity and overall site usage/loading. Having this information would be helpful as we start SLA related conversations. **The BayWeb network is designed as a 4th generation broadband network based on cellular network design principles. As such, the network can support broadband and multimedia applications including streaming video. Specific details of how streaming video might work can depend on several different factors.**

As the question implies, factors such as site proximity and site loading may impact how streaming video or any other application can be used in the network. In general users closer to the site or on a lightly loaded cell will experience higher data rates which may mean the ability to view higher quality video streams or multiple video streams. More specific information will be discussed as details such as user distributions, applications types, and use cases etc. are more specifically defined and understood. The intent is to obtain the optimal user experience given the grant guidelines and availability of sites.

HARMAN LAUDS \$154M GRANT, CALLS FOR NATIONAL INTEROPERABLE EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS NETWORK

~ Lawmaker says: "With this grant, our ability to prevent, protect and respond to natural and man-made disasters will be dramatically enhanced." ~

Washington, DC – Rep. Jane Harman (D-Venice) today lauded the award of a \$154 million federal grant for the LA-Safety Net of the Los Angeles Regional Interoperable Communications System (LA-RICS).

It is the single largest grant of its kind in the nation. The LA-Safety Net will provide instantaneous communications among the region's 34,000 first responders, giving them access to the Internet, databases, broadband communications with 9-1-1 call centers, real-time video streaming, medical telemetry and more. It will benefit 10 million residents within a 4,000-square-mile jurisdiction.

Harman also called for the national build-out of the 700 megahertz spectrum for a national interoperable emergency communications network, and enactment of bipartisan, bicameral legislation (HR 5907) to hold a national competition to develop public safety communication devices which are cheaper and more capable than those currently available.

"It is welcome news to the residents of LA County, the largest county in America, which has seen wildfires, earthquakes and riots, and has the potential for tsunamis and major terror attacks.

"With this grant, our ability to prevent, protect and respond to natural and man-made disasters will be dramatically enhanced," said Harman. "But state-of-the-art regional emergency response, important as it is, still does not address the glaring need for a national interoperable emergency communications network – a project long stalled at the federal level and one that has been a priority of mine since 9/11.

"Today's news is huge – a big down payment on a safer future. I am honored to have played a role in it," said Harman.

Harman appeared at LA City Hall with Mayor Antonio Villaraigosa, Sheriff Lee Baca, County Supervisor Gloria Molina, County Supervisor Michael Antonovich, Los Angeles County CEO William Fujioka, and

regional leaders from the public safety community including Police Chief Charlie Beck and Fire Chief Millage Peaks.

Attached is the full text of her prepared remarks:

This is the largest single grant ever to a regional emergency communications network, and I am proud of the partnership among the Department of Commerce, Congress, county and city elected officials to make this happen.

It is welcome news to the residents of LA County, the largest county in America which has seen wildfires, earthquakes and riots, and has the potential for tsunamis and major terror attacks.

With this grant, our ability to prevent, protect and respond to natural and man-made disasters will be dramatically enhanced. But state-of-the-art regional emergency response, important as it is, still does not address the glaring need for a national interoperable emergency communications network – a project long stalled at the federal level and one that has been a priority of mine since 9/11.

No one will forget that many first responders died that day because the NYPD helicopters circling overhead could not warn firefighters climbing up the World Trade Center towers that the towers were glowing red and immediate evacuation was required.

Firefighters from different departments who swarmed the Pentagon that day could not communicate with each other or the federal government.

Locally, there have been numerous instances where firefighters have had to swap radios or rely on runners and drivers to relay messages during an emergency. This occurs when responders carry different equipment operating on different frequencies.

We have 34,000 first responders in the LA region, and LA-RICS will provide instantaneous communications among them – access to the Internet, databases, broadband communications with 9-1-1 call centers, real time video streaming, medical telemetry, and more.

At long last, our urban first responders will have what our military has had on foreign battlefields – for years.

This money will enable us to construct 176 new wireless sites and leverage the capability of 114 existing sites.

It will benefit 10 million residents living in 88 municipalities within a 4,000-square-mile jurisdiction which includes 22 airports, the nation's top two container ports, refineries, chemical plants, and the center of America's aerospace and entertainment industries. It will make our region the model for the nation.

And it, hopefully, will spur action on urgent unfinished business: the national build-out of the 700 megahertz spectrum for emergency communications, and enactment of bipartisan, bicameral legislation (HR 5907) to hold a national competition to develop public safety communication devices which are cheaper and far more capable than those currently available.

Today's news is huge – a big down payment on a safer future. I am honored to have played a role in it.

Thank you for your emails dated September 15, 2010 and September 17, 2010. Motorola has given further consideration of what information would be appropriate to release to the City of San Jose and has determined that it is unable to meet your request for a full copy of the NTIA grant application.

Some of the information in the application is either not the property of Motorola or is protected under non-disclosure agreements. Other major portions of the application, including technical and cost information, contain Motorola trade secrets that are protected from disclosure. If Motorola's trade secret information was disclosed, Motorola's competitors would inevitably use this information to our company's detriment. Motorola believes in open communications, however, for these reasons, we cannot release any attachment or correspondence associated with its due diligence process specific to its application.

As you might know, the BayRICS Policy Group has presented to Motorola a list of questions about the BayWEB project submitted by the City of San Jose and there is a meeting scheduled for September 29, 2010 to answer these questions. Motorola understands that the City of San Jose will be represented at that meeting. Motorola anticipates that this meeting will be informative and that the City's attendance will enable a greater understanding of the major factual aspects of the project.

Motorola was pleased by the statement in your email that the City of San Jose seeks to be an active partner on the BayWEB project.

San Jose and Oakland locked out of emergency broadband test

Silicon Valley / San Jose Business Journal - by Mary Duan

San Jose has been shut out of a federally funded rollout of a broadband emergency communications network in the Bay Area, and city and county officials want to know why.

Those officials fear that losing out on a \$50 million grant may eventually mean they could lose out on a \$604 million full-scale buildout of a more reliable and cheaper communications system for emergency responders, along with the construction work and jobs that go with it.

Mayor Chuck Reed and County Executive Jeff Smith have questioned how the grant was awarded to **Motorola Inc.** and asked the **Department of Commerce** to withhold the money until their questions can be answered.

At the center of their concerns is how Motorola and a Bay Area group chose the cities and counties for the pilot project, dubbed “Project Cornerstone.”

The group that determined participants in the pilot project is the Bay Area Urban Area Security Initiative, or UASI, which is run by Executive Director Laura Phillips. She came to the UASI after working in government relations at Motorola and serving as a public safety official in Sunnyvale and San Francisco, two of the cities that have been chosen to participate. She also started her career as an emergency dispatcher in San Jose, which was not chosen.

Reed and Smith, in a Sept. 8 letter sent to U.S. Commerce Secretary Gary Locke, said the process that was used to select Motorola as the vendor for the broadband initiative funded by Federal Recovery Act dollars “doesn’t reflect our standard for accepted procurement practices.”

The city said despite the UASI’s “approval authority” board — which includes representatives from the **San Jose Fire Department**, **Oakland’s Department of Emergency Services**, CalEMA, San Francisco’s **Emergency Management Department**, the **San Francisco Fire Department** and the Alameda County Sheriff’s Department — no vote was ever taken on which cities would participate in the pilot program.

Motorola stays mum

According to a statement from Motorola, the cities of Santa Clara, Sunnyvale and San Francisco, as well as Alameda and Contra Costa counties, will participate in the pilot of the unified, state-of-the-art broadband network serving multiple agencies across the Bay Area. The pilot program is supposed to begin in mid-October, according to trade publication **Urgent Communications**.

Asked to describe how the cities were chosen for the rollout, Motorola spokesman Matt Messinger said Motorola “doesn’t comment on customer deployments prior to system completion and customer acceptance,” and referred questions about system details to UASI.

Phillips could not be reached for comment in time for this paper’s deadline.

Motorola said the full public safety system will be installed this year and is expected to be operational in 2011. A combination of federal, local and state funding is planned to pay for the full \$604 million buildout. The system is known as an LTE, which is short for Long Term Evolution of Universal Terrestrial Radio Access Network. Such networks can be used for fixed, portable and wireless broadband access and are aimed at increasing capacity, reducing network complexity and lowering costs.

Oakland questions award

Oakland has also joined in questioning the Project Cornerstone funding after it too was apparently shut out of the rollout phase of the project. In a Sept. 3 letter to UASI, the city’s interim **Information Technology** director, Ken Gordon, said the initial \$6 million in grant funding for the project was to be divided evenly between Oakland, San Francisco and San Jose. San Jose says the \$2 million it was supposed to get for the initial rollout was reallocated without its permission.

So the city officials want to know what happened.

While Gordon’s formal appeal was specific to Oakland, he wrote that Oakland, San Jose and San Francisco were pivotal in securing a waiver from the **Federal Communications Commission** that will grant Motorola the rights to the 700 MHz public safety spectrum needed for the project.

At least part of the network was slated to be operational beginning Oct. 15 for the 2010 "Urban Shield," a simulation to demonstrate the Bay Area's ability to manage ongoing critical incidents through the use of multiple incident commands.

The exercise is described as a "critical component" for the Bay Area's mission for homeland security.

Emergency broadband project

What it is:

A broadband emergency communications network linking police and fire in multiple cities and counties in the Bay Area, expected to cost \$604 million.

How it is funded:

A public-private partnership between Motorola and the Bay Area Urban Area Security Initiative applied for Federal Recovery dollars. The U.S. Department of Commerce allocated a \$50 million grant to the partnership for a pilot project.

Who is the Bay Area Urban Area Security Initiative?

The UASI is made up of representatives from the following:

- San Jose Fire Department
- Oakland's Department of Emergency Services
- CalEMA
- San Francisco's Emergency Management Department
- San Francisco Fire Department
- Alameda County Sheriff's Department

Participants in the pilot project:

Cities of Santa Clara, Sunnyvale and San Francisco, as well as Alameda and Contra Costa counties

When:

The pilot program is expected to begin in mid-October. The full buildout is expected to begin this year and be operational by 2011.

The conflict:

San Jose and Oakland say no vote was taken by members of the UASI for which regions would participate in the pilot program, and say part of the grant that they were promised was reallocated without their permission.

This public-private partnership, led by Motorola, aims to deploy both a public safety broadband network employing state-of-the-art wireless technologies and standards, as well as a public access wireless broadband network in the greater San Francisco Bay Area. The San Francisco Bay

Area Wireless Enhanced Broadband Project (BayWEB) proposes to deploy broadband services at 200 existing public safety sites that will support a total of 567 public safety facilities with speeds of up to 6.5 Mbps. The project's public access component plans to offer capacity at speeds up to 160 Mbps to community anchor institutions in the Bay Area. The partnership between Motorola and public safety entities will be overseen by the Bay Area Regional Interoperability Communications System (BayRICS). The Bay Area will test LTE technology with real-world public safety applications and users, providing invaluable information and data to the public safety community, the FCC, ERIC and the NIST Demonstration Project.
